The financial state of the health and social care in England continues to dominate the headlines. The Guardian is providing extensive coverage over the coming month. The deadline for digital roadmaps in England has been moved from April to June 2016. There has been plenty of recent technology coverage from CES 2016 in Las Vegas. There is a new report from Scripps Institute on a small randomised controlled trial linking various medical devices to a smartphone. Ali Parsa's Babylon Health has secured \$25m of funding to develop an AI symptom checking app. The widely publicised Sugar Smart app aims to get people in the UK to reduce their sugar intake. There is a new patient management app from the UK. There is plenty of IoT news, predictions for 2016 as well as robots for all sorts of possible home-based tasks. A new book by Joe Kvedar 'Internet of Healthy Things' has been published and look out for AARP's 'Caregiving Innovation frontiers...leveraging technology to transform the future'.

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1.2 Wired for Health Study

A six month randomised controlled trial led by Scripps Institute found that there were no short term benefits in health costs or outcomes for people using smartphone connected devices for health monitoring.

The Wired for Health <u>Study</u> led by Eric Topol covered 160 patients with hypertension, diabetes, or arrhythmia and randomised them into an intervention group and a control group.

The intervention group had an iPhone with connected devices for blood pressure, blood glucose and ECG. A care coordination platform was also used.

The study looked at claims data as well as outcomes data like blood pressure and HbA1C. No difference was found between the two groups apart from the fact that the monitoring patients had a better sense of wellbeing and felt more control over their health. There was no significant increase in healthcare access from the monitoring group due to the technology.

As with many of these trials, a number of issues were identified:

- Short period of time covered only 6 months
- Small numbers used in trial
- Some technical and adherence issues

1.3 Babylon Health app raises \$25m in funding to predict future of your health



According to the **Telegraph**, Ali Parsa's Babylon Health has raised \$25m to develop artificial intelligence within its app.
