

**News Headlines: 30 April 2015** 

March 2015 was the last Telecare LIN <u>newsletter</u> supported by Innovate UK, KTN Ltd and the Assisted Living Innovation Platform and we would like to thank them for their support in recent years.

There were over 1500 links of interest during April 2015 with over 100 journal articles – sadly, we are unable to bring them to you in a curated format at this time.

Going forward we need your support. To maintain a comprehensive monthly news summary going out to over 48,000 people, we are looking to crowdsource funding to support the website, content and hundreds of links and <u>journal article references</u> each month. We are currently looking for a number of organisations to support continuing production (including <u>supplements</u>, <u>Twitter stream</u>, <u>archive</u>) at around the £5k level per year. The news service, currently in its tenth year is recognised as an authoritative source and valuable resource in the UK and in other parts of the world working on digital health, telehealth, mHealth, telemedicine and telecare.

## Some UK News Headlines this week

(i) In a Guardian <u>letter</u>, Professor Chris Ham from the King's Fund and Nigel Edwards from the Nuffield Trust question the Election bidding war over NHS funding — "All the parties must spell out when their pledges of extra funding will translate into hard cash to address the growing black hole in NHS finances...and discussion about social care funding is a serious omission from the election debate and an issue that none of the three main parties have addressed." Also from the Guardian: What will the election mean for the UK's public services?

- (vii) Maggie Winchcombe <u>argues</u> that the way assistive living products are marketed can turn people off due to negativity around old age She considers that this needs to change.
- (viii) King's College Hospital NHS Foundation Trust has become one of the first trusts in the UK to use the newly launched Apple Watch as part of patient care in chemotherapy (EHI report).
- (ix) The Welsh Government has <u>announced</u> an extension of its fund to integrate health and social care.
