The newsletter provides some coverage of the recent King's Fund International Congress on Telehealth and Telecare. We are still waiting for the publication of the peer-reviewed Whole System Demonstrator papers, however, some provisional findings on cost-effectiveness, quality of life and hospital admissions were covered at the Congress. This newsletter also provides further updates on the government's Three Million Lives initiative, The Assisted Living Innovation showcase event in Bristol, a new network for telehealth integration and interoperability and the AKTIVE Project which is looking for participants to join focus groups.

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Item 1 - The King's Fund International Congress on Telehealth and Telecare

Organised by The King's Fund and the University Medical Centre, Utrecht (UMC), this second annual <u>event</u> brought together key speakers from around the world to showcase innovation and best practice in the implementation of telehealth and telecare.

In addition to the physical three day congress in London attended by 500 delegates, many of the presentations as well as access to the exhibitors were available through an online virtual event with 600 getting involved over the three days. There were 1500 Tweets appearing in the timelines of 131,000 people. A number of <u>videos and presentations</u> are available for further viewing to those who have registered (free).

Along with a keynote speech from Minister, Paul Burstow covering Three Million Lives, WSD headline findings and potential savings, the Congress also included some presentations on the provisional WSD results. Final publication of the first set of papers is due in the coming weeks following peer review. The areas covered at the conference related to cost-effectiveness, quality of life and reductions in hospital admissions for telehealth. Data was collected and interviews carried out at various stages during the 12 months of the trial and it is important to understand the links between the five themes of the trial. There has been some mixed coverage of these provisional findings. Without the final papers and an extensive discussion on the interpretation of the findings it is difficult to draw conclusions so we will return to the results in a future newsletter.

Nick Goodwin from the King's Fund has written a blog looking back over the three days of the congress and there has been coverage in the HSJ and online news sites such as Pulse Today and EHI.

Item 3 - Telehealth integration and interoperability - new NHS Networks site

The NHS Technology office and ITK recently ran a very successful Telehealth workshop hosted by Intellect in London. The workshop was to discuss previous work done on telehealth standards, to poll the NHS and industry to determine what has changed and, get attendees' views on integration and interoperability priorities going forward.

The result was broad consensus across the 40 attendees on what the top three priorities are for integration, being able to refer patients for telehealth, being able to click through from one system to a telehealth system to view patient information in context, being able to send patient vital signs information from the telehealth system to the responsible care team members. To enable further and wider discussion ITK have set up a NHS Networks site. This has seen a good rate of membership however we are keen to have more join and actively take part in the discussions already there. We will also use the Network as the announcement vehicle for future events.

Item 4 – 3 Million Lives News

An event to update industry on 3millionlives, and to raise interest and generate further support, was held on 29 February 2012 at Intellect's offices in London. The meeting attracted a wide representative group of organisations and companies involved in the telecare and telehealth market. Over 50 companies were represented.

Stephen Johnson (DH) and Angela Single (chair of the industry group) jointly chaired the meeting. Stephen presented an outline of the reason for undertaking the 3millionlives campaign and the background to the development of a partnership between DH and industry.

The four trade associations (Association of British Healthcare Industries (ABHI), Intellect, Medilink and Telecare Services Association (TSA)) outlined their role in the campaign and the market representation that they brought to the work.

An outline of a work programme for the first six months and then longer term deliverables was presented to the industry group. This was followed by an opportunity for attendees to identify the areas of work that they saw as the greatest priority.

A lively Q and A session stimulated lots of debate on governance of the campaign, the financial commitment sought, and the outline business plan.

Early indications of support for 3millionlives were very positive with a number of companies making an immediate commitment to contribute to the ongoing industry response to 3millionlives and a number of others expressing their interest in committing.

Today 1.5 million care workers provide vital support across England. As our population ages, their work is becoming ever more important. Care workers' roles are changing, however, as they work with growing numbers of older people at home in poorer health. Technology is now frequently used in older people's homes to monitor risks and dangers and help keep them safe. Known as 'telecare', this enables some to stay at home for longer, and is used by many local authorities and families.

Our study is trying to find out how telecare - including pendant alarms, motion sensors and risk detectors — affects the work of home care workers. We also hope to hear their views on working with older people when telecare is in place. To do this we are running discussion groups with home care workers to find out about their work and what part telecare plays in their daily work routines.
